

WESTERN SYDNEY RIFLE CLUB

DETAILS FOR SHOOTING CALENDAR EVENTS

MEDAL NIGHT: Shooters shoot for medals e.g. Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Diamond in two categories: Scoped Rifle and Open Sights. You must declare your medal attempt to the range officer on the designated day and have your target signed by the Range Officer or a Committee Member before shooting. Scores required for each medal are:

OPEN SIGHTED RIFLE:

Bronze 150 and over
Silver 165 and over
Gold 180 and over
Diamond 200

SCOPED RIFLE:

Bronze 195 and over
Silver 198 and over
Gold 200
Diamond 200.20x

Monthly Medal Days are indicated on the Club Calendar. One attempt allowed each month for Open Class, Hunter Class and Open sighted rifle.

HUNTER CLASS DETAIL RULES:

Sporting Rifles used in this event must meet the following specifications.

Maximum weight: 7lb 12oz or 3515 grams.

Maximum width of stock: 2.25 inches or 57.16 mm.

Maximum Scope magnification: 6 power, variable scopes to be set at 6 power.

Rifle must have a working magazine.

Targets: Red 20 spot target. 1 shot per target. Unlimited sighters. Time limit: 25 minutes.

3/4 HUNTER CLASS BENCHREST: This event is shot over 4 weeks as per the Hunter Class Detail Rules (See above). Only one score to be entered each week. The best 3 scores out of 4 are added for the total. This is a graded shoot. You will be graded on the previous years 6 best targets. If you have no grade you will be graded by the Club Captain.

Master Grade 200

A grade 197 to 199.9

B grade 194 to 196.9

C grade 193.9 and under.

Trophies are awarded for First Place in each grade only.

* Please note: Whatever day/night of the week you shoot and submit your first target for this event you must shoot and submit the rest of your targets on the same day/night of the following weeks for the duration of the competition. If you work shift work or are sick, contact the club captain for approval to shoot on another night or day.

OPEN CLASS DETAIL RULES: Weight and make of rifle unlimited. Scope power, unlimited.

Targets: Black 20 spot target. 1 shot per target. Unlimited sighters. Time limit: 25 minutes.

3/4 OPEN CLASS BENCHREST: This event is shot over 4 weeks as per the Open Class Detail Rules (See above). Only one score to be entered each week. The best 3 scores out of 4 are added for the total. This is a graded shoot. You will be graded on the previous years 6 best targets. If you have no grade you will be graded by the Club Captain.

Master grade 200

A grade 198 to 199.9

B grade 194 to 197.9

C grade 193.9 and under.

Trophies are awarded for First Place only in each grade

* Please note: Whatever day/night of the week you submit your first target for this event you must shoot and submit the rest of your targets on the same day/night of the following weeks for the duration of the competition. If you work shift work or are sick contact the club captain for approval to shoot on another night or day.

DENVALE CUP: This event is contested twice a year. You are required to shoot seated at the bench using only your elbows for support. One detail is shot, best scoring target wins. Second target shoot-off in the event of a tie. Target used is the big black 5 spot target, 5 shots in each target in 7 minutes. Perpetual trophy and small trophy cup awarded to winners.

BR-30: Involves shooting 1 shot at each of 30 bullseyes in 15 minutes. Scoring is based on worst edge instead of the usual best edge. Rifles are weighed prior to the match to calculate a penalty based on the weight of the rifle, the higher the weight the greater the penalty on the score. This event is contested twice a year, the two scores are combined for a final result. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies awarded.

SMALLEST GROUP SHOOT: Any .22 cal rifle, with unlimited scope power can be used. Three 5-shot groups are shot in 25 minutes on one target. This event is contested twice a year, your smallest groups are added together for a final result. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies awarded.

SKIPPY SHOOT: This is a back-to-basics competition, in which all competitors fire 15 scoring shots in 10 minutes using open sighted .22 calibre rifles. Only shots in the black are scored. All sighting-in is carried out prior to the competition. Perpetual Trophy. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies awarded.

200 BADGE WINNER: In this event all the 200 badges you shoot in a calendar year are calculated. The member with the highest number wins. Perpetual Trophy. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies awarded.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP SHOOT: Only members who shoot 10 times or more in Open or Hunter Class are invited to participate in this event. Three targets are shot as per the Open Class Detail Rules (See above). Perpetual shield and club jacket to the winner. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies awarded.

JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP SHOOT: This shoot is designed to encourage our younger shooters to be more active in our club. Members under 18 years of age will be invited to participate. Three targets as per the Open Class Detail Rules (See above). Perpetual Shield. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies awarded.

HUNTER CLASS CHAMPIONSHIP SHOOT: Three targets as per the Hunter Class Detail Rules (See above). Perpetual Trophy. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies awarded.

AUTUMN INVITATION SHOOT: This shoot is designed to bring some of our other shooting clubs and members together for a shooting competition. Events will be 3 targets as per the Open Class Detail Rules (See above), and 3 targets as per Hunter Class Detail Rules (See above). Hunter Class is shot off gun, Open Class is graded.

Open class grades:

A grade 198 and above

B grade 194 to 197.9

C grade 193.9 and under.

Medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in all grades and 1st, 2nd and 3rd in Hunter Class. Open Class and Hunter Class scores are combined for Top Gun and the top ten place getters. Cost to be fixed by the committee. Lunch provided for a small fee.

SPRING INVITATION SHOOT: Our Open Class Benchrest Shoot will be an All Range Shoot:

One target at 20 meters

One target shot at 50 meters

One target shot at 50 meters using a modified target (smaller 10 ring and x ring) to simulate 90 meters

All targets scored by Inward Gauging, [best edge scoring] all other rules are the same.

GRADES: Open Class Grades are based on an average of the best 6 scores submitted over two 6 month periods, January-June and July-December. The average will be your grade for the next 6 months.

Open Class Grades are as follows:

Master grade 200

A grade 198 to 199.9

B grade 194 to 197.9

C grade 193.9 and under.

Hunter Class are based on an average of the best 6 scores submitted over two 6 month periods, January-June and July-December. The average will be your grade for the next 6 months.

Hunter Class Grades are as follows:

Master grade 200

A grade 197 to 199.9

B grade 194 to 196.9

C grade 193.9 and under
